Guest Speaker - Linda Brain

Linda was employed at the Wellington gaol for 3 years as a Services and Programs Officer, until 12 months ago when she returned to Coonabarabran to provide company for her father Tony.

'Services' meant she acted as a liaison between prisoners and the outside world, helping them when leaving, linking them to available services in the community, and solving problems for them while in prison.

'Programs' that she ran were designed to change attitudes and behaviour with the aim of reducing recidivism or repeat offending.



Others employed there included correction officers, education officers who provided literacy and numeracy classes, as well as guidance for those seeking tertiary study, trainers in industry skills (eg in the bakery), and those responsible for the health of inmates. There were also people able to teach Aboriginal languages, and provide mentoring, strategies that came out of the deaths in custody findings. Working in the prison, for example in the kitchen, laundry or in the grounds, is one way for inmates to earn money. Two transition houses are available in Wellington for people about to be released, However, although

Linda appreciated the fact that overall she was treated with respect, but it was dispiriting to observe how the absence of sufficient support after release means that it is very hard for people to avoid going straight back into old ways and behaviours. Thank you, Linda for enlightening us about some of the features, good and maybe not so good, of our corrective facilities system.
