Guest Speaker Elizabeth Barkley from the Coonabarabran Hospital Auxiliary


Elizabeth gave an excellent presentation outlining the role of the auxiliary and some of its work in recent years. Here are some of the points she made in her speech:

She was eager to reassure listeners that all the money raised in this community goes only to the local hospital.

- The Auxiliary has 28 members, 15 of whom are able to be active, sometimes even fewer 'on the ground' workers.
- They have a very good relationship with the Health Service Manager Susan Berry, and this greatly enhances the effectiveness of their work.
- Some of the developments include more visiting specialists, video facilities, a three-chair renal ward for dialysis, and a hoverjack machine valued at \$11,000.
- A new venture is a Healthy food and drink dispenser which will mean that refreshments will be always available rather than only when the kiosk can be opened by the Auxiliary members.

They have an on-going wish list of items to add to the hospital, and are keen to see the Region assist by sharing the cost of some of these.
